II. Policing Action

A. CPOP

3. W. Liberty Project: No updates
4. Lighting at Tot Lot: If Duke will allow, we will have an electrician install the lights. CRC is asking for us to pay the monthly payment of the lights, so we will begin to look into funding sources (possibly PHW building blocks grant). The lights will cost \$11-\$12 a month per light, and they will be placed on 3 different poles.
5. Bus Stops: We may be able to move a few of the bus stops from the corners.
6. The MetLife grant that we submitted for Drug Disruption has been submitted to the second round of the competition.

B. Police Department

1. Auto Theft Campaign: The campaign is underway to educate residents about preventing auto theft. The Safety C.A.T. has been asked to help distribute flyers. If available people are asked to come out on April 18th to pass out flyers in Price Hill.
2. Crime Stats were passed out for both East and West Price Hill
3. Resident Concern: It was brought up at the Safety CAT meeting that people are not obeying the law of stopping when a bus has its stop sign out. This has been occurring near the Roberts Paideia/Dater Montessori school campus.

D. Treasurer Report: Bob Greenlee

1. A total of \$277.44 is in the Safety CAT aluminum can fund.
2. Patti will be turning in all the aluminum cans collected on Earth Day, when there is a premium on the aluminum.

E. Court Watch Program

1. An impact statement is being sent to the prosecutor and judge in charge of the "Bike Bandit" case as well as those in charge of the case against the individual who was arrested for shooting through BLOC's windows.

F. District 3 Community Relations and Resource Committee: Linda Ackerman

1. Linda reported to the group that at the last Resource meeting, the representatives were given the list of sexual offenders in the district. Those interested in

viewing this list were encouraged to contact Linda.

2. It was brought to the attention of the Resource Committee about the rise in GPS theft from vehicles.

3. National Night Out planning is underway. The site this year will be the Krogers parking lot on Ferguson Road. Volunteers are needed for this event.

G. 2009 Projects

1. Recruitment of Volunteers: Linda is still seeking to make contact with various school groups and school administration. She will also look into doing an educational presentation with Kara at the next Education C.A.T. meeting.

2. Street Parties: The Safety CAT will hold two street parties this summer: June 27th @ McPherson and August 1 @ Iliff. The June 27th street party will include a car show put together by the Warsaw Merchants. The show would include 20-25 cars, and we will look into parking them in the side lot of Krogers. This street party will go from 9-4pm with food being served from 12-3. Doughnuts and coffee will be given out in the morning to those with cars. We will need to send out letters to those residents affected by the street closing. Kara will also be checking into whether or not Manna is open that Saturday. The August 1st street party will run from 11-3 and we will be partnering with BLOC Ministries to host this party. The Mayor may also make an appearance at this event, but Kara will check on the details of his visit.

3. Conduct three community seminars in the fall, surrounding different neighborhoods issues. The 1st seminar will be held Sept. 23rd and will be taught by the Probation Department. The 2nd seminar will be held Oct. 14th and will be taught by Buildings and Inspections. The 3rd seminar will be held Nov. 4th and will be taught by the Cincinnati Police Department. The group asked that Buildings and Inspections speak on the timeframe and process of the system and how to identify issues that need to be addressed.

4. 2nd annual Celebration of Price Hill Potluck dinner will be held on October 28th.

5. Great American Clean-Up will occur on April 25th from 9-1pm. There will be three staging areas: Elder Schaeper Center, Elberon United Methodist, and CVS Pharmacy (Corner of Glenway and Guerley). We were challenged by the community councils to double our number of volunteers. A community picnic will follow at Elberon UMC.
